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✓HOUSE BILL 1107 (Committee Bill)

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF GREENWICH TO MAINTAIN A MUNICIPAL HOSPITAL.

Favorable Report

The town is authorized to maintain an existing hospital as a municipal hospital. The executive supervision of the hospital is given to the Health Officer subject to the advice of a Hospital Board to consist of the members of the Board of Health and three members of the Board of Estimate and Taxation to be appointed by the Board of Estimate. The measure also provides that the Town may care for others than those unable to pay, in this hospital.

✓HOUSE BILL 1107 (*committee Bill*)

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF GREENWICH TO MAINTAIN A MUNICIPAL HOSPITAL.

Favorable Report

The Town of Greenwich is authorized in this bill to maintain the hospital for communicable diseases now existing. The executive supervision of the hospital is placed with the Health Officer, subject to the advice and direction of a Hospital Board consisting of the Board of Health and three members of the Board of Estimate and Taxation, to be appointed by the Board of Estimate and Taxation. The hospital is authorized to care for patients who are unable to pay, also for those able to pay.
