Mr. Gaynor Brennan:

This bill reverses the order as it makes it necessary to get permission to have music whereas the Commission now has the power to take away the privilege if it is abused. This bill comes before the legislature every year and receives an unfavorable report. For example if a club decided to have a dance they would have to call up the Liquor Control and get the permission first and it would seem that it would cause great dissatisfaction among the Permittees. The present law is sufficient if properly administered.

Liquor Control Commissioner: This is simply transferring to Statutes what simply is now a regulation, that all wholesalers having permits or desire permits from the Commission are required to have storage facilities proper and adequate for this type of permit applied for.

This bill has just a minor change as to storage facility.
