Affairs on Senate Bill No. 472 "An Act concerning the Governor's Horse Guards." Calendar 1272, File 447.

MR. HAGGARD (GROTON):

I move the acceptance of the committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

THE SPEAKER:

Question is on acceptance of the committee's favorable report and passage of the bill. Will you remark?

MR. HAGGARD (GROTON):

The first and second companies of the governor's horse guards may each consist of one major, one captain, two first lieutenants and so forth. The only change here is "and second companies" and the word "each". This bill will place the second company of the Governor's Horse Guards on the same status as the other units of the Governor's Guards, because of the uncertainty of our present military situation and it is recommended this bill be passed.

General Moore: I'm in favor of this action.

Chairman Minetto: Any questions? Anyone against this bill?

We'll now open hearing on S.B. No. 472.

S.B. No. 472 (Senator Ablondi) AN ACT CONCERNING THE MILITARY DEPARTMENT.

General Quinn: This bill is with reference to tables of organization of the Governor's Horse Guards.

This bill is introduced in order that Section 1327 of the General Statutes shall include an organization structure for the Second Company Governor's Horse Guard, an active unit of the Organized Militia, for whom a table of organization has not been prescribed in the statutes.

Senator Watson (Committee Member): Were your bills processed through the Legislative Department?

General Quinn: Yes. We typed them and then sent them over for incorporation.

Chairman Minetto: Anyone else? We'll now open on S.B. No. 473.

S.B. No. 473 (Senator Raynsford) AN ACT CONCERNING THE MILITARY DEPARTMENT.

General Quinn: This bill is submitted in order to include units of the Organized Militia, both Governor's Guards and State Guard, in legislation already in effect, granted such members who are state employees benefits formerly granted to members of the National Guard, Naval Militia or other reserve components.

Senator Watson: What is the plan for payment of the State Guard?

General Quinn: They are paid under the same rates as the United States Army when called out by the Governor or when at camp or for regular drills.

Representative Foord of Litchfield: I just came up. I hope you will act favorably on the bill (H.B. No. 334 Mr. Spencer) AN ACT CONCERNING THE SALARIES OF THE ADJUTANT GENERAL AND ASSISTANT ADJUTANT GENERAL,
