S.B. No. 488 (Senator Levy) AN ACT CONCERNING CONFESSIONS AND ADMISSIONS.

Chm. Pruyn: Is there anyone in favor of this bill?

Howard Jacobs, New Haven: There is a need for a statute covering the criminal cases and we broaden the scope of a pre-trial.

Chm. Pruyn: Is there anyone else in favor of this bill? Is there anyone opposed to it? The hearing is closed on S.B. No. 488.

S.B. No. 510 (Senator Levy) AN ACT CONCERNING SURVIVAL OF ACTIONS AND CAUSES OF ACTIONS.

Chm. Pruyn: Is there anyone in favor of this bill?

Attorney Horowitz, New Haven County Bar Association: The purpose of this bill is to simplify the procedure for the lawyers. Section 8337 of the general statutes is repealed and the substitution of this section is to simplify the procedure for citing in a decedent's executor or administrator.

Attorney Arthur Giddon, Hartford: It is good.

Chm. Pruyn: Anyone else in favor? Anyone opposed? The hearing is closed on S.B. No. 510.

S.B. No. 512 (Senator Levy) AN ACT CONCERNING APPEALS TO THE COURT FROM ZONING BOARDS OF APPEAL.

Chm. Pruyn: Is there anyone in favor of this bill?

Attorney Horowitz: It is felt by this bill when the matter is brought before the Court of Common Pleas, there will be an adequate and sufficient record, so that the court can fully and properly determine the case.

MR. SPEAKER:

Question is on acceptance of the committee's favorable report and passage of the bill. Will you remark, Sir?

MR. MILLER (STAMFORD):

This increases the number of judges for the municipal court of New Haven from two to three judges who shall be appointed. The judges shall appoint a prosecuting attorney, one or more assistant prosecutors, a clerk and one or more assistant clerks each of whom shall hold office for a period co-terminous with that of the judges appointing them. I hope the bill passes.

MR. LAING (WINDSOR):

I understand the other day while I was away the count got up to 21½, not that I consider New Haven only half a point but there is only one judge so in order to get the figure even, I want you to know its 22½, 23 now, or rather 22 now and we hope we will get that third judge some day.

THE CLERK: Cal. No. 358. Senate Bill No. 478. An Act concerning procedure in actions for accounting. Favorable report of the Committee on Judiciary. File No. 292.

Upon motion of Senator Jewett of the 20th District for acceptance of the favorable report and passage of the bill, the bill was passed)

SENATOR JEWETT: Mr. President, this allows the court in an action for accounting to accept the fees and expenses of the auditor. I think it is a good bill.

THE CLERK: Cal. No. 359. Senate Bill No. 20. An Act concerning appeals from Probate. Favorable report of the Committee on Judiciary. File No. 291.

(Upon motion of Senator Ryan of the 31st for acceptance of the favorable report and passage of the bill, the bill was passed.)

SENATOR RYAN: Section 7072 of the General Statutes now limits the time within which appeals may be taken and as, presently written, the statute is confusing. If one wishes to question a bill on the 31st day of December, he would have normally 3 more days.

THE CLERK: Cal. No. 360. Senate Bill No. 510. An Act concerning survival of action and causes of action. Favorable report of the Committee on Judiciary. File No. 309.

(Upon motion of Senator Hall of the 5th District for acceptance of the favorable report and passage of the bill, the bill was passed)

SENATOR HALL: This bill allows the plaintiff, in the case of a deceased defendant, to apply to the court in which said suit is pending for an order to substitute such decedent's executor or administrator in the place of such decedent.

THE CLERK: Cal. No. 361. Senate Bill No. 485. An Act concerning theft from the person. Favorable report of the Committee on Judiciary/ File No. 289.

(Upon motion of Senator Jewett of the 20th district for acceptance of the favorable report and passage of the bill, the bill was passed)

SENATOR JEWETT: This adds the penalty of a \$1,000 fine. Previous to this time there has only been a 5 year jail sentence.

THE CLERK: Cal. No. 362. Senate Bill No. 377. An Act concerning statements of pre-marital blood tests. Favorable report of the Committee on Public Health and Safety. File #288.

(Upon motion of Senator Grant of the 27th district for acceptance of the favorable report and passage of the bill, the bill was passed)

SENATOR GRANT: This bill is to permit the pre-marital blood tests certificates being given on the basis of adequate receipt and testimony from other states and other health officers in other parts of the country. It is reciprocity.

THE CLERK: Cal. No. 363. Senate Bill No. 565. An Act concerning crematories at public institutions. Favorable report of the Committee on Public Health and Safety. File No. 287.
