Substitute for House Bill No. 1458 " An Act Providing for a Pension for Edith W. Seig." Calendar 519 File No. 329.

MRS. SCHMELTZ (NORFOLK):

This bill provides a pension of \$50 a month for a period of two years for Edith W. Seig in recognition of her faithful years of service as a teacher in the public schools and because of her ill health. I move the acceptance of the committee's favorable report and the passage of this bill.

THE SPEAKER:

THE CLERK:

Favorable report of the committee on Finance on Substitute for House Bill No. 1604 "An Act concerning Town Expenditure in Excess of Appropriations." Calendar 520 File No. 320.

MR. LEE (PROSPECT):

This bill permits, with the approval of the towns' boards of finance and other proper authorities that transfer may be made from excess in appropriations to cover deficiencies in other appropriations within the budget, a transfer of surplus. It permits the borrowing of funds with the approval of the board of finance and the inclusion in any town's budget a provision for two per cent contingency fund. This is a good measure and will simplify the manner of financial transactions in town operation. I ask for the approval of the committee's favorable report

and passage of the bill.

THE SPEAKER:

THE CLERK:

Favorable report of the Committee on Public Welfare and Humane Institutions on Substitute for Senate Bill No. 64 "An Act concerning Commitments to Mansfield State Training School and Hospital and the Southbury Training School." Calendar 521, File No. 234.

THE CLERK: Cal. No. 535. Substitute for House Bill No. 297.

An Act concerning registration of milk dealers. Favorable report of the Committee on Agriculture, File No. 328.

(Upon motion of Senator Hall of the 5th district for acceptance of the committee's favorable report and passage of the bill, the bill was passed.)

SENATOR HALL: This bill provides for milk dealers to register annually, during the month of April rather than May, in order that information may be available to milkmen who register commencing the 1st of June. It deletes the word "daily" from the statutes, which has no further use.

THE CLERK: Cal. No. 536. Substitute for House Bill No. 1458.

An Act providing for a pension for Edith W. Seig. Favorable report of the Committee on Public Personnel. File No. 329.

(Upon motion of Senator Watson of the 4th district for acceptance of the committee's favorable report and passage of the bill, the bill was passed.)

SENATOR WATSON: This bill provides for the payment of \$50. per month for the next two years to Edith W. Seig in recognition of her faithful service as a teacher in the public schools.

THE CLERK: Cal. No. 537. Substitute for House Bill No. 1608. An Act concerning town expenditure in excess of appropriations.
