THE CLERK: Business from the House. (Change of reference, JSC on Judiciary, House Bill No. 934 referred to Liquor Control; JSC on Judiciary, House Bill No. 908 to Liquor Control; Committee House Bill No. 1530 referred to Finance; Committee House Bills Nos. 1531 and 1532 referred to Judiciary) (Upon favorable reports, the following bills were referred to the calendar: JSC on Incorporations, House Bill No. 118; JSC on Incorporations, Sub. for House Bill No. 383; JSC on Judiciary, House Bill No. 274; JSC on Cities and Boroughs, House Bills Nos. 314, 316, 321; JSC on Judiciary, House Bills Nos. 426, 638 and Sub. House Bill No. 902)

THE CLERK: Business from the calendar. Favorable report, Cal. No. 51, Senate Bill No. 46. An Act providing for a Pension for Anna F. Norton. Favorable report of the Committee on Public Personnel.

SENATOR LEVY OF THE NINTH DISTRICT: Mr. President, I move the acceptance of the committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

SENATOR LEVY OF THE NINTH DISTRICT: This bill provides for a pension of \$50. a month for a period of 2 years in recognition of 41 years service as a teacher in the public schools of Meriden. I might also add this is a re-current bill and it has been approved by several previous sessions, since it provides for two years only.

S.B. No. 211 (Borden) AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH THE JEWISH CHILDREN'S SERVICE ORGANIZATION MAY FILE ACCEPTANCE TO ITS CHARTER.

Fannie Himmelstein, Hartford: A special act organizing this Association was passed by the General Assembly in 1951. It came to our attention that the Association never filed an acceptance of the charter. This Association is a successor to one in existence for over forty years. We would like the time for filing this acceptance extended until November 30, 1953.

S.B. No. 299 (Opalacz) AN ACT CONCERNING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CHARTER OF THE MIDDLESEX HOSPITAL AND THE CHANGE OF ITS NAME TO MIDDLESEX MEMORIAL HOSPITAL.

Senator Opalacz: I would like to register in favor of this bill to change the name of the Middlesex Hospital.

Senator Parr: I, too, am in favor of this bill.

H.B. No. 383 (Laing) AN ACT AMENDING THE CHARTER OF THE ODD FELLOW'S HOME OF CONNECTICUT.

Llewellyn Bromfield, Jr., President, Odd Fellows Home: I'd like to register the approval of this change by our members that are here, most of whom are officers of the organization, and state that the reason is this: We had an appraisal made of our properties and holdings about a year ago, and I find in my report of a year ago that I had to put our present day valuation at \$1,041,000, which is about that which we are allowed to have under the present laws enacted in 1943, although we had made no improvements. We had the evaluation for insurance purposes, then this came upon us. The first meeting of the Legislature is now, and that is why we are here. We would like to bring this before you, and to say we have these gentlemen here to speak for the enactment of this legislation. We would like to contemplate some extensions, and our endowments increase by donations, so there is a constant increase in our operations.

Stanley W. Hosmer: I want to register in favor of this bill.

Philip Soifer, Board of Managers: I would like to register in favor of this bill.
