House Bill No. 1082, "An Act concerning Transfer Agents or Other Fiduciaries". Favorable report of the Committee on Judiciary. Calendar No. 797. File No. 574. Mr. Speaker, this bill simplifies the procedure for transfer agents and other fiduciaries, in cases where trust is involved. I move acceptance of the Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

House Bill No. 1910, "An Act concerning Retirement of Municipal Employees Before Usual Retirement Age". Favorable report of the Committee on Public Personnel. Calendar No. 744. File No. 543. Mr. Speaker, this bill amends the Municipal Retirement Act. It provides that if an employee is separated from the service for any reason other than cause or resignation and completes at least thirty years of continuous service before reaching the voluntary retirement age, he shall be entitled to a retirement allowance upon reaching the voluntary retirement age, or accept a lesser retirement, commencing on the date of separation. This bill is occasioned by an individual case, which seems especially meritorious. It is a good bill and I

Mr. Speaker, this bill would allow any State Employee, who became an employee of the U. S. Employment Service for Connecticut, between January 1, 1942 and November 15, 1946, who was reinstated in the State Service to obtain credit for retirement purposes for this period of service - provided he shall pay to the retirement fund for each month of service, a sum equal to one-half of five per cent of his gross yearly rate of compensation, as of the date of such request, with interest at 4%. Payment may be made in twelve equal monthly instalments. This bill presently affects six employees. It is a good bill and I trust it will pass.
