MR. POPE (FAIRFIELD):

Mr. Speaker, this resolution refers to the Legislative Council the question of increase in mileage for members of the General Assembly and a per diem allowance. This is something that has been a question for sometime and this is the possible solution. I move the adoption of the resolution.

Question is on adoption of the resolution. Those in favor say "aye"; opposed? The "ayes" have it. The bill is passed.

Favorable report of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary on House Bill 41 "An Act concerning the Jurisdiction of Municipal Courts, and Concurrent Jurisdiction Over Certain Actions of the Superior and Common Pleas Courts." File is 82.

MR. PINNEY (BROOKFIELD):

Mr. Speaker, this act raises the jurisdiction of amounts of the minor courts and of our Courts of Common Pleas. It raises the justice court from \$100 to \$250; it raises our Class B Town Court from \$500 to \$1,000; It raises our Class A Municipal Courts from \$1,000 to \$2,500 and incidently provides an automatic transfer to Courts of Common Pleas on matters in excess of \$1,000 on motion of either party. It raises the jurisdiction of the Court of Common Pleas from \$2,500 to \$5,000 and it sets the area of concurrent jurisdiction of the Court of Common Pleas and Superior Court from \$5,000 to \$10,000. This bill is necessitated by the gradual backlog of work and we think it will give our courts an

C-130 opportunity to spread the work load a little bit better. It is a good bill and I move acceptance of the Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

THE SCALAR PRODUCT

DEFINITION

Let \mathbf{u} and \mathbf{v} be vectors in \mathbb{R}^n .

The scalar product of \mathbf{u} and \mathbf{v} is denoted by $\mathbf{u} \cdot \mathbf{v}$ and is defined by

$$\mathbf{u} \cdot \mathbf{v} = u_1 v_1 + u_2 v_2 + \dots + u_n v_n$$

$$= \sum_{i=1}^n u_i v_i$$

$$= \mathbf{u}^T \mathbf{v}$$

$$= \mathbf{u} \cdot \mathbf{v}$$
