H. B. No. 555 - Lewis - AN ACT CONCERNING THE APPROPRIATION FOR THE WINDHAM COUNTY LAW LIBRARY.

The present set up of the County library is that they are going in debt a few thousand dollars each year and the increase would put them in a much better position to fill the needs of the members of the Bar.
