THE CHAIR:

Senator Proctor of the 20th district.

SENATOR PROCTOR:

Mr. President, I move for acceptance of the House Amendment Schedule "A".

THE CHAIR:

Care to remark?

SENATOR PROCTOR:

It is only one more of the technical parts of this entire 57 page bill. It is perfectly acceptable, I move its passage.

THE CHAIR:

Are there further remarks on House Amendment Schedule "A"?

If there are no further remarks the question is on acceptance of the House Amendment Schedule "A". Those in favor will signify by saying "aye". Opposed. House Amendment Schedule "A" is adopted.

Care to remark on the bill?

SENATOR PROCTOR:

I move for acceptance of the bill as amended. The bill itself is one of those biennial bills whereby the Legislative's Commissioners Office come up with technical questions - technical corrections to legislation that has already passed. The members of the Senate will note that it is 57 pages long and unless anyone would like, I would rather not go into the complete details of

The Gentleman from New Hartford had a non-controversial matter.

MR. EDDY OF NEW HARTFORD:

Mr. Speaker, it's Calendar No. 999, File No. 1156. ^{H B. 4388} Mr. Speaker, I move reconsideration of our former action for the purpose of adopting a technical amendment.

THE SPEAKER:

The question is on reconsideration. All those in favor say aye. All those opposed? Alright.

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MR. EDDY OF NEW HARTFORD:

Mr. Speaker, the Clerk has an amendment.

THE CLERK:

This is House Amendment Schedule A offered by Mr. Eddy of the Town of New Hartford. This bill, House Bill 4388. File 1161. The amendment is as follows: In section 76, line 27, strike out the word "acceptance" and insert in lieu thereof the word "satisfaction". Strike out section 22.

MR. EDDY OF NEW HARTFORD:

Mr. Speaker, the purpose of this amendment is to simply make the word "satisfaction" the same as where it is used earlier in that section and thereby to clarify it. The purpose of striking out section 22 is that that item is already taken care of in a revision of the laws relating to dogs and therefore should not be in this bill and the way it is done in this bill is in conflict with the other proposal and I therefore move adoption of the amendment.

THE SPEAKER:

The question is on adoption of the amendment. Will you remark further? If not, all those in favor say aye. All those opposed? The amendment is carried.

MR. EDDY:

Mr. Speaker, I would hope that the amendment is technical and that I might - I now move acceptance of the committee's joint favorable report and passage of the bill as amended by House Amendment Schedule A.

THE SPEAKER:

The question is on acceptance of the committee's favorable report and passage of the bill as amended by House Amendment Schedule A. Will you remark?

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MR. EDDY OF NEW HARTFORD:

Mr. Speaker, this is the very long bill which is- which clarifies and straightens out some of the inconsistencies which have been found in the statutes over the two-year interim between the two Legislatures. I hope the bill will pass.

THE SPEAKER:

Will you remark further?

MR. LOYZIM OF COVENTRY:

Mr. Speaker, that amendment was read very rapidly. In section 76 what line was that correction made in?

MR. EDDY:

Line 27.

MR. LOYZIM:

Now, on the other Section 22. I see that it does pertain to dogs and

MR. EDDY:

There is a bill which bears a joint committee favorable report to the Gentleman from Coventry, if I may, Mr. Speaker, which revises the laws relating to dogs and it's taken care of there. If we pass both this and the other one the two will be in conflict.

MR. LOYZIM:

But neither one of those bills have passed yet have they?

MR. EDDY:

It's only one bill and let me make it clear that it is not the controversial dog bill. This is simply, as I understand it, to straighten out the procedure but it is up for action.

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MR. LOYZIM OF COVENTRY:

Well, can you give me the actual bill that is covered? I just want to be very sure that we are covered.

MR. EDDY OF NEW HARTFORD:

I cannot give you the bill number.

MR. PADULA OF NORWALK:

Mr. Speaker, if this continues much longer I am going to ask that we pass retaining. We would like to adjourn within the next two or three minutes and if this takes on this complexion we'll be here all day.

THE SPEAKER:

This will be passed retaining. The Clerk will read in some bills.

This is a favorable substitute report of the House Committee on Appropriations on Substitute for House Bill No. 3805. An Act concerning Medical Assistance for the Aged.
