Mr. Gallant: State, on a competitive examination which is promotional. Two, what about the trainee who completes the six months or a year internship? Will he be guaranteed a job? Or will he then have to take a competitive examination? Will others be exposed to that same competitive examination? If so, how do you guarantee him that he is not wasting the year? If the top three people will be appointed. You don't know. You are offering them nothing concrete. What about retirement? Will these people be given a years credit toward retirement? This should be resolved before it is decided upon by a committee. These are only some of the issues that have to be gone into, there are people who are concentrating on this area, people of the public personnel committee. We would urge Mr. Chairman that your committee discuss the matter with your official chairman of your committee and with Mr. Epgos, Sen. Gaffney, and perhaps consider, that we would urge you to transfer the bill.

Rep. Petroni: Thank you. Any one else in opposition? If not we will proceed to H. B. 4496 Appointment of guardians of the estate of minors. Any one in favor of that bill? Any one in opposition? The next bill is H.B. 4497 Amendment of Section 14-251.

Mr. Chr.: My name is Harold Mulvey, I'm corporation council for the City of New Haven. If I may I would like to speak also on 4498, 4499, and 4502. They are all connected.

Rep. Petroni: Yes, that will be permissible.

Mr. Chr.: Chapter 249 of the general statutes is entitled Uniform Traffic Control on Highway Safety. In that chapter the legislature set up traffic authority for our various cities and towns. Then gave them power to do certain things concerned with traffic. In other words it gave them charge of traffic problems in their respective cities and towns. However, when they set that up they either forgot or overlooked or however it arose, I don't know, but in any event in various sections these four sections which I've put in bills here, contain language with indicate that the legislative body of the town also has control of traffic. 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in some measure a housekeeping bill for the Circuit Court in that it refers to commitment to the jail administrator in keeping with other statutes rather than commitment within the county. In addition, it would eliminate the necessity of a hearing of probable cause where the possible fine in the offense was \$1,000. In effect, Mr. President, we feel that this bill would increase the stature of the Circuit Court in that they would not be required to hold the bindover proceedings for an offense of this nature, and only where the offense carried the possible penalty of five years.

Mr. President, I move for acceptance of the committee's favorable report and passage of the bill. This bill would raise from two to three thousand dollars the figure at which a guardian would have to be appointed in the probate court in order to approve settlement of a negligence action or something of that nature. I think that it's in keeping with the rising cost of living and since this was last changed, and I think it's

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a worthwhile bill.

The purpose of this bill is to extend the state's interest in participation in community psychiatric clinics.
