The present statutes prohibit the employment of a member of a board of Education as a Teacher or a School Janitor in the town of which he is a member of such a board. This would appear to make it impossible for a teacher or a janitor in a private school, to serve as a member of a board of Education. A change of the word "in" to "by" a town this bill makes clear that persons employed by private schools may serve as members of the board of Education

The present law provides for professional employees of local boards of education shall be entitled to a minimum of 10 days annually which may be accumulated to 60 days. This bill adds regional boards of education and extends a minimum annual sick leave from 10 to 15 days, and the accumulated sick leave from 60 to 75. The state employees have a leave up to 120 days so this is quite a bit less than that. Many other states have more than 75 days and in Connecticut we have 38 towns that already give 90 days. I trust the bill will pass.
