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THE CLERK:

Calendar no. 775 - file no. 871 - House Bill No. 3391. An Act concerning Changes in the Tree Warden Laws.

Favorable report of the Joint Committee on State Development.

MR. ORCUTT (GUILFORD):

Madam Speaker, the Clerk has an amendment.

THE CLERK:

This is House Amendment Schedule "A" offered by Mr. Orcutt from the town of Guilford. The Amendment is as follows:

Strike out section 5 and insert a new section 5 as follows: Subsection (f) of said section is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof: Any person, firm or corporation, other than a tree warden or his deputy, who desires the cutting or removal, in whole or in part, of any tree or shrub or part thereof within the limits of any public road or grounds, may apply in writing to the town tree warden, the borough tree warden or the highway commissioner or other authority having jurisdiction thereof for a permit so to do. Upon receipt of such permit, but not before, he may proceed with such cutting or removal. Before granting or denying such permit, such authority may hold a public hearing as provided in section 23-59, and (the same conditions of appeal shall be applicable, except) when the applicant is a public utility corporation, the party aggrieved by such decision may, within ten days, appeal therefore to the public utilities commission, which shall have the power to review, confirm, change or set aside the decision appealed from its decision shall be final. (in which event the appeal shall be taken to the public utilities commission, which shall

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have the powers granted to it under section 16-234, provided, if an application for such permit has been made to either a tree warden or the highway commissioner or other authority and denied by him, an application for a permit for the same relief shall not be made to any other such authority.

MR. ORCUTT (GUILFORD):

Mr. Speaker, this amendment restores language that was originally in the bill. It does provide for appeal to cover the utilities commission. Its a good amendment and I urge its adoption.
