Mr. Speaker, this bill provides for property tax exemption by Eleemosynary Organizations. With subsection 9 through 16, of section 12 to 81 of the General Statutes. The tax on record between the day of conveyance and the end of the tax year is presently not covered. Each session of the Legislature faces many requests of churches for abatement of this portion of the tax. Which has practically always been granted. This bill gives the municipality the authority to abate the tax at the local level through regular ordinance procedure. Where local citizens are knowledgeable about the request of abatement. This is a good improvement

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to the present statute and I urge the passage.

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Municipal Financing of Sewerage Systems. Favorable report of the Joint Committee on Finance.

SENATOR VERRIKER:

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the joint committee's favorable report and passage of the bill. The bill increases from five to ten years the time within which any municipality may issue temporary notes to be paid from the anticipated income from sewer assessments. These notes are to be renewed annually, and the Joint Finance Committee recommends passage.

An Act concerning the Property Tax Exemption of Eleemosynary Institutions. Favorable report of the Joint Committee on Finance.

SENATOR VERRIKER:

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the committee's favorable report and passage of the bill. This bill authorizes any municipality to give a property exemption effective upon the date of purchase to any religious, charitable, or educational institution who purchases property. This will be a voluntary act because if the municipality chooses to wait to the next assessment to grant such exemption, it may do so. The Joint Finance Committee recommends its passage.

Calendar 721, file 555, substitute HB 5369, An Act concerning Validating Certain Acts of the Assessor of the Town of Darien. Favorable report of the Joint Committee on General Law.

SENATOR FAULISO:

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the joint committee's favorable report and passage of the bill. Mr. President, a number of taxpayers in the Town of Darien applied to the agent of the tax assessor and received adjustments after the town assessor or his agent could act. This validates the act of that particular agent. There are approximately two hundred seventy-five taxpayers affected by the agent's act. There are no suits involved, and there was no opposition. It is the feeling of the committee that this particular bill should pass to validate the act of this particular agent.
