In many many cases, in fact in the majority of the cases, the attorney really doesn't mean to do this but unless he know the amount of the insurance involved, he has no way of knowing the limit of the insurance, and has no way of adjusting his complaint. He feels that this is the good bill for the plaintiff, who certainly can show, but equally good for the defendents who are paying the policy, or rather the premium for such policy.
