CAL. NO. 439. File No. 1007. Favorable report of the Joint Committee on Insurance. House Bill No. 6662. An Act concerning Solicitation of Insurance Contracts from Credit Cardholders. As amended by Senate Amendment Schedule "A" and House Amendment Schedule "A".)

SENATOR LYDDY:

Mr. President, I move for adoption of the committee's favorable report and passage of the bill, as amended. The amendment was merely a technical law which clarifies the bill. I move passage.

THE CHAIR:

Any further remarks? If not, as many who are in favor signify by saying, "aye". Opposed? The bill is passed.

THE CLERK:

CAL. NO. 660. File No. 1007. Favorable report of the Joint Committee on Insurance. Substitute for House Bill No. 8556. An Act concerning Company Terminations of Insurance Agency Contracts and by the Orderly Transition of Business.

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THE CLERK:

The Clerk has received from the House, two House Joint Resolutions on recall because of technical defects on the bills which they would like to get returned as soon as possible. This is House Joint Resolution No. 247. Resolution Recalling House Bill No. 6662 from the Legislative Commissioners' Office.

SENATOR LYDDY:

Mr. President, may I move for adoption of the resolution on recall. There is a technical amendment which has to be made and the House needs it. Would you appoint a committee to return the bill to the House.

THE CHAIR:

The Chair will appoint Senator Lyddy. Question is on adoption of the resolution. All in favor signify by saying aye, opposed. The resolution is adopted.

THE CLERK:

Clerk has an additional House Joint Resolution. House Joint Resolution No. 248. Resolution Recalling Substitute Senate Bill No. 1483, from the Office of the Governor, again a technical correction must be made.

THE CHAIR:

Question is on the adoption. Senator Jackson from the 5th.

SENATOR JACKSON:

Mr. President, I move for acceptance of the resolution.

THE CHAIR:

The Chair will appoint Senator Jackson. As many who are in

Will you remark further on the bill as amended. If there are no further remarks as many who are in favor signify by saying aye, opposed. The ayes have it and the bill is passed as amended.

THE CLERK:

While the Chairman of Insurance is on his feet, I have a bill received under recall. This is a favorable report of the Joint Standing Committee on Insurance on House Bill no. 6662. An Act concerning solicitation of Insurance Contracts from Credit Card Holders.

THOMAS C. SALAMONE, 84th District:

Mr. Speaker, the committee on conference has met and we reject Senate Amendment Schedule A.

MR. SPEAKER:

Motion is on rejection of Senate Amendment Schedule A, will you remark?

Mr. Speaker, Senate Amendment Schedule A was put in in error and this was agreed upon at the committee conference as we rejected it.

The Clerk now has House Amendment Schedule A.

Mr. Speaker, I believe I indicated to the Clerk that the committee on conference is not yet prepared to report out on Calendar 423.

MR. SPEAKER:

With no report available from the committee on conference may this item then appear on the calendar as having been retained today.

THE CLERK:

On page 18, Calendar 436, Substitute for House Bill 8556. An Act concerning Company Terminations of Insurance Agency Contracts and the Orderly Transition of Business as amended by House Amendment A and C and Senate Amendment Schedule A.

THOMAS C. SALAMONE, 84th District:

Mr. Speaker, the committee on conference has met and we move passage of Senate Amendment Schedule A.

MR. SPEAKER:

Question then is on adoption of Senate Amendment Schedule A, will you remark?

THOMAS C. SALAMONE, 84th District:

Mr. Speaker, it is a good amendment, it should pass.

MR. SPEAKER:

Are there any more cogent remarks on the amendment? If

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is an Act concerning the administration of the elector's oath and literacy test. It is only five lines long but there is a technical error in the bill and the Secretary of State has requested this recall.

MR. MCKINNEY: (141st)

We support the resolution.

THE SPEAKER:

This may be the briefest debate of the afternoon. All those in favor indicate by saying AYE. Those opposed. The resolution is ADOPTED and this time I would name a committee of the gentleman from the 78th, Rep. Papandrea and the gentleman from the 165th, Rep. Collins as the Committee on Recall.

THE CLERK:

House Joint Resolution No. 247. Resolution Recalling House Bill 6662 from the Legislative Commissioners' Office, introduced by Mr. Salamone.

MR. AJELLO: (118th)

Mr. Speaker, I move suspension of the rules for immediate consideration of the resolution.

THE SPEAKER:

Is there objection. Please proceed with the adoption of the resolution. Will the Clerk read the resolution.

THE CLERK:

Resolved by this Assembly:

That a committee of one senator appointed by the presi-

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dent pro tempore of the senate and two representatives appointed by the speaker of the House be appointed to request the legislative commissioners to return House Bill 6662 for further consideration.

MR. AJELLO: (118th)

I move adoption of the resolution.

This is the bill which the members will recall dealt with solicitation of insurance contract by credit card. The Chairman of the Committee informs me that there is an error in the bill and this is the reason for its Recall.

MR. MCKINNEY: (141st)

We support the resolution, Mr. Speaker.

THE SPEAKER:

All those in favor indicate by saying AYE. Those opposed. The resolution is ADOPTED. On the Committee on Recall I would name the gentleman from Waterbury, Mr. Mahaney of the 92nd and the gentleman from New Britain, Mr. Gaffney of the 29th.

MR. AJELLO: (118th)

MR. MCKINNEY: (141st)

Could I make a point of clarification or correction on the Calendar at this point. Page 8 of today's Calendar. Cal. 1270, Substitute for House Bill 7182, File 1447, I believe should have no stars as it was not in our file as of yesterday.

THE SPEAKER:

The gentleman from the 141st is correct.

THE CLERK:

CHANGE OF REFERENCE. Favorable Substitute Report of the Joint Standing Committee on Finance. Substitute for Senate Bill 813. An Act concerning the Establishment of the Connecticut Mortgage Authority. Report of the Committee is that this should be referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

THE SPEAKER:

So ordered.

THE CLERK:

Change of Reference favorable Substitute Report of the House Joint Standing Committee on Public Personnel. Substitute for Senate Bill 957. An Act concerning Hospitalization, Medical and Major Medical Insurance for State Employees and Their Dependents. Report of the Committee is that this bill ought to pass and be referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

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MR. PAPANDREA: (78th)

For the record, I would so move.

THE SPEAKER:

All those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Opposed.
The bill as amended is ADOPTED. Is there objection to suspension for transmittal on this item of recall. Hearing none the rules are suspended and with no objection the item is transmitted.

MR. SALAMONE: (84th)

Mr. Speaker, as a member on the Committee on Recall on House Bill 6662, I move that House Amendment Schedule "A" be rejected.

THE SPEAKER:

Question is on rejection of House Amendment Schedule "A".
Will you remark.

MR. SALAMONE: (84th)

This was a technical error, Mr. Speaker, and this is to straighten out the bill.

THE SPEAKER:

You have heard the report of the Committee on Recall. There is a motion to reject the amendment. Will you remark further. If not, all those in favor of rejection, indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed. The Amendment is REJECTED.

MR. SALAMONE: (84th)

Mr. Speaker, the Clerk has an Amendment.

THE CLERK:

House Amendment Schedule "B", offered by Mr. Salamone.

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In line 7 after the word "State" insert "unless such authorized insurer is licensed to issue policies of life or accident and health insurance and has a licensed insurance agent of record in this state for such purposes".

MR. SALAMONE: (84th)

Here again it is a technical amendment to clarify the bill. Inadvertently the wrong wording was put in. I move adoption of House Amendment Schedule "B".

THE SPEAKER:

Will you remark further on the adoption of the amendment. If not, all those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed. The amendment is ADOPTED.

MR. SALAMONE: (84th)

I move acceptance and passage of House Bill 6662 as amended by House Amendment Schedule "B".

THE SPEAKER:

Question is on acceptance and passage as amended. Will you remark further.

MR. SALAMONE: (84th)

It's a good bill and it should pass.

THE SPEAKER:

Are there further remarks. If not, all those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed. the bill is PASSED.
