This bill merely amends the existing law, the existing law requires a golf country Club that is applying for a Liquor Permit to be in existence for at least one year. By this amendment it will permit bonofied formed organization which has no less than twenty members to apply for a permit upon the membership paying a year's dues and filing an affidavit to the effect that they intend to remain members of the club for at least a year. It's a good bill and I urge its passage.
