SENATOR PAC:

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the Joint Committee's Favorable Report and passage of the bill.

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THE CHAIR:

Will you remark?

SENATOR PAC:

This bill would delete the requirements of the wholesalers that they have in their employe a license pharmacist or a qualified chemist. They are merely middle men. And there really is no need to have a licensed pharmacist on hand. They are in short supply I understand. And there is really no need to have them around. I think its a good bill. It would help us in other areas of our dispensing of drugs by having this bill passed.

Sen. Pac: Any other questions? Thank you, sir. Commissioner Dunn.

Barbara Dunn, Commissioner of Consumer Protection: I would first like to draw your attention to bill 1520 (AN ACT UPDATING THE DEFINITIONS OF MANUFACTURERS AND WHOLESALERS OF DRUGS), and I have taken the liberty of taking notes from the back table and bringing them up because this bill has a typographical error. We have brought it to the attention of Ellen Burns. Several words were left out and it still was printed and she is having it reprinted. Line twenty-nine, after the word state of Connecticut, the word should be included specifically, there are only eight or nine words, specifically including pharmacies and licensed patent medicine outlets. The purpose the purpose of this medicine, is licensing those who manufacture or distribute devices not currently covered by statute. There's no problem but those were, do need to be added and if that copy can be returned to Ellen Burns, she'll prepare a jacket for signature. It's just a simple typing error when it was prepared.

Bill 1105 (AN ACT CONCERNING ADDITIVES TO BREAD) has not been drafted. It's by title only. We would like to reserve comment and come back when we see a drafted copy of this bill.

Bill 1510 (AN ACT REMOVING THE REQUIREMENT THAT A PHARMACIST OR CHEMIST SUPERVISE DISPENSING OF DRUGS TO WHOLESALERS) is a department bill which was kindly signed again by Senator Pac, Senator Zajac, Representative Cohen and Representative Rose). This is the act removing the requirement that a pharmacist or chemist supervise dispensing of drugs to wholesalers. This bill would remove the section which now requires that a wholesaler or a distributor have a chemist or pharmacist present at all times. Since the sole function of the wholesaler is to distribute drugs which are already packaged and already labeled, we think it is perhaps unnecessary that a pharmacist or a chemist be hired to be there because it is just a distribution. The purpose of this person to be there to, in a professional capacity so that this we feel needs not to be there.

I've already commented on 1520.

Bill 7575 (AN ACT CONCERNING THE LABELING OF FOOD PRODUCTS) it is our understanding that this bill has already been heard at General Law, and we have testified. It's an act concerning the labeling of food and we have had this at General Law already.

Bill 7670, and I don't see that here. It was listed. This bill in our opinion should be changed to General Law. This is a dating bill and it has been heard or will be heard over there. It was listed in the bulletin yonder.
