SENATOR PAC:

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the joint committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

THE CHAIR:

Remarks?

SENATOR PAC:

This bill would permit any local planning or zoning agency to use the soil mapping service of the U.S. Soil Conservation Service as a basis for determining the use for land. Now they approached this work in a very diligent manner. They have laboratories studies of the physical, chemical and biological properties concerned. And currently the state has been mapped in three areas. Tolland, Litchfield and Hartford Counties. There are 887 thousand other areas that have been mapped. There are one million more to go. Now this provides a very good basis for the future use of our land.

THE CHAIR:

Further remarks? Question is on the acceptance of the committee's favorable report and passage of the bill. Those in favor indicate by saying aye. Opposed. The ayes have it. The bill is passed.
