an Act concerning gifts of real property interests to minors.

JOHN A. CARROZZELLA:

Mr. Speaker, I move for acceptance of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of the Bill.

MR. SPEAKER:

Question's on acceptance and passage. Will you remark.

JOHN A. CARROZZELLA:

Mr. Speaker, the Clerk has an Amendment.

THE CLERK:

House Amendment Schedule "A", offered by Mr. Stevens, of the 122nd, and Mr. Carrozzella, of the 81st. In Line 85, after the word "custodian" insert the words "as custodian." In Line 86, after the word "minor" insert the words "under the Connecticut Uniform Gifts to Minors Act." In Line 119, after the word "testator", and in Line 154, after the word "custodian", insert the following: "in the form provided in subsection (5) of Section 45-102 (a)."

JOHN A. CARROZZELLA:

Mr. Speaker, the purpose of this Amendment is to conform the language of the new Bill to the language of the Uniform Gift to Minors Act. It's a good Amendment. I trust it will pass.

MR. SPEAKER:

Further remarks on the Amendment. If not, the question's on adoption of House Amendment Schedule "A". All those in favor

Mr. Speaker, I now move for acceptance and passage as amended by House Amendment Schedule "A".

MR. SPEAKER:

Will you remark.

JOHN A. CARROZZELLA:

Mr. Speaker, presently under the Uniform Gifts to Minors Act the only things that can be held as custodial property are securities, money, life insurance policies and annuity contracts. The purpose of this Bill is to allow real property to be held as custodial property, so that gifts can be made to minors under the provisions of the Uniform Gifts to Minors Act. I think it is a significant Bill because I think there are many instances when gifts of real property would...gifts should be made to minors. Those people who want to make gifts to ^{such} minors of real property, but cannot do so. This Bill would permit that.

MR. SPEAKER:

The bill amends Section 51B of the 1969 Supplement. It requires the Judicial Review Council at the request of the Governor to submit its recommendation concerning the reappointment of any Judge whose term of
