MR. SPEAKER:

Representative Brown of the 148th.

REPRESENTATIVE BROWN:

I move acceptance of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

MR. SPEAKER:

Question is on acceptance and passage. Will you remark.

REPRESENTATIVE BROWN:

Mr. Speaker, this is a bill that would allow flexibility of the Department of Correction to accept a person under arrest while they are being arraigned. From time to time after an arrest they are in the official custody of the police department making the arrest until the person appears in court and then remanded by the court to a Community Correctional Center. This particular bill would make it possible that when such arrest is made, that inmates may rather than shall be received by the Commission of Correction to a Correctional Center or institution. There are some inmates that will need immediate medical care and should be done at the immediate attention by the police department involved. This is a very important bill for the Department of Correction and I urge its adoption.

MR. SPEAKER:

Further remarks on the bill. If not, all those in favor indicate by saying "Aye". Those opposed. The bill is passed.

SENATOR CIARLONE:

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

The key to this bill is found in the second to the last line of the first page. Wherein the word "shall" is changed to "may". Temporary certain inmates remain in official custody of the Police Department in making the arrest until such time as he appears in court and is then remanded by the court to a community correctional center. There have been occasions when the corrections department has been asked to take and made temporary surrender inmates, who are obviously in poor physical condition who require medical attention for the health and safety of the inmate such inmate should not be processed into the correctional facility but rather should be given immediate attention. A good bill and urge adoption.

SENATOR MANDANI:

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the joint committee's favorable report and passage of the bill, in concurrence with the House.

Mr. President, this is a technical amendment to existing statutes to change the word separated rather than discharged due to the fact that currently under the selective service act, one might be separated before his six year requirement is up, and he is not discharged. So it puts it in line with this.
