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Calendar No. 374, House Bill No. 6039. An Act Concerning the Posting of Security Deposits in Connection with Certain Accidents.

ROBERT G. OLIVER, 104th District:

Mr. Speaker, I move acceptance of the joint committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

MR. SPEAKER:

Question is on acceptance and passage, will you remark?

ROBERT G. OLIVER, 104th District:

The Clerk has an amendment.

MR. SPEAKER:

Will the Clerk call the Amendment, Schedule "A"?

THE CLERK:

House Amendment Schedule "A", offered by Mr. Stevens of the 122nd District.

In line 30, bracket the words "one year has" and insert in lieu thereof the words "TWO YEARS HAVE."

ROBERT G. OLIVER, 104th District:

It corrects a clerical error. I move its adoption.

MR. SPEAKER:

Motion is on adoption, House Amendment Schedule "A", will you remark further? If not, all those in favor indicate by saying aye, those opposed? The amendment is adopted, it is ruled technical. We may proceed with the bill as amended.

ROBERT G. OLIVER, 104th District:

Mr. Speaker, this bill corrects another clerical error

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made in the last session. We extended the statute of limitations in negligence from one year to two years. We neglected to make the appropriate provisions in certain other sections of the General Statutes dealing with security deposits and other such provisions. It's a good bill. It conforms to the law. It's housekeeping. It ought to pass. I move acceptance of this bill, passage as amended by Schedule "A".

MR. SPEAKER:

Motion is on acceptance and passage as amended by Amendment Schedule "A", will you remark further? If not, all those in favor indicate by saying aye, those opposed? The bill is passed.

THE CLERK:

Calendar No. 375, House Bill No. 6270. An Act Concerning Commitments by the Juvenile Court.

PETER W. GILLIES, 75th District:

Mr. Speaker, may that matter be passed temporarily?

MR. SPEAKER:

If there is no objection, so ordered.

THE CLERK:

Calendar No. 376, Substitute for House Bill No. 6277. An Act Concerning the Equalization of Jury Terms.

PETER W. GILLIES, 75th District:

Mr. Speaker, I request that that matter be referred to Appropriations.

MR. SPEAKER:

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THE CLERK:

Calendar No. 354, File No. 283, and 505, Favorable Report, Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary, House Bill 6039, An Act concerning the posting of Security Deposits in connection with certain accidents.

THE CHAIR:

Senator Jackson.

SENATOR JACKSON:

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the Joint Standing Committee's Favorable Report and passage of the Bill.

THE CHAIR:

Will you remark?

SENATOR JACKSON:

Mr. President, two years ago, we extended the statute of limitations from one to two years. This Bill is an effort to also change from one to two years, all of the existing State law, specifically with reference to the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, where problems have arisen where the Security Deposits have been returned after the one year period because suit has not been brought or a judgment has not been rendered.

THE CHAIR:

Question is on passage of the Bill. All those in favor, indicate by saying -

Senator Petroni.

SENATOR PETRONI:

I just have one question, does this Bill take effect October 1?

SENATOR JACKSON:

Unless it's specified, it's October 1. I don't see any specification so it will be October 1.

THE CHAIR:

Question is on passage of the Bill. Those in favor, indicate by saying aye. Opposed, nay. Ayes have it. The Bill is passed.

THE CLERK:

Calendar No. 356, File Nos. 250 and 506, Favorable Report, Joint Standing Committee on General Law, House 1737, An Act concerning validating the Notice given by John J. Barry and granting him permission to prosecute to final effect the suit against the City of Danbury.

THE CHAIR:

Senator Strada.

SENATOR STRADA:

Mr. President, I move for acceptance of the Joint Committee's Favorable Report and passage of the Bill as amended by House Amendment, Schedule A.

THE CHAIR:

Will you remark?

SENATOR STRADA:

Mr. President, this Bill validates a defective notice dated July 16, 1969, with respect to injuries sustained on March 11, 1969, against the City of Danbury. Suit was instituted within the statutory period and it's merely a validation of a defective notice.
