MR. CHAGNON (97th):

Mr. Speaker, I move acceptance of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of this bill in concurrence with the Senate.

Mr. Speaker, this bill allows the Department of Corrections and the Federal Bureau of Prisons to contract with each other for the use of their respective facilities when it is to the advantage of the parties concerned and many times also to the advantage of persons who are being retained in these institutions. THE CHAIR:

Senator Ciarlone.

SENATOR CIARLONE:

I move acceptance of the committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

THE CHAIR:

Will you remark?

SENATOR CIARLONE:

Mr. President, this bill allows the Connecticut Department of Corrections to Contract with the Federal Bureau of Prisons to Contract with each other for detention of inmates under their respective custody. Every year there are numerous federal

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prisoners awaiting trial in Federal Courts in our state of Connecticut. Who are conveniently lodged here while the Federal Courts convene. Passage of this bill would also enable Connecticut like other states who contract with the Federal Bureau of Prisoners under existing guidelines. ITS A GOOD bill, it would expedite our judicial matters. I urge adoption.
