CAL. NO. 552. Favorable report of the joint committee on the Environment. Substitute House Bill No. 6474. An Act Concerning the Powers and Duties of Conservation Officers.

SENATOR PAC:

I move acceptance of the joint committee's favorable report and passage of the bill. This bill would delete from the powers of the part-time conservation officers, special conservation officers and others that are concerned with game. These powers deleted would be the ones that are underlined section 53-108 which is one in respect to arresting anyone entering illegally with the purpose of hunting and fishing. And the section 53-110 trespassing on property of the Board of Fisheries and Game and 53-118 which is destruction of earth food plants. And section 53-123, wilful injury to property of another. all these are stricken from the powers of arrest that he has without a warrant. However, in the powers of a full conservation officer, he has the same powers that any officer in any other line of duty would have, but, related just to the particular environment he is working in fish and game. Under these powers, of course, he does have the power to any violation of the wild fowl out of season and the other violations concerned with it. He can go into any vehicle and anything you might be carrying along and check and see if you have anything of hidden game or fish. However, he does not have the power of warrant to go into your trailer home
