- Wm. E. Glynn: the bill is much too broad to do that and I would also suggest that if there's any feeling on the part of the committee that they wanted to go in the direction outlined by the statement of purpose, that the Association would certainly like an opportunity to propose legislation although we are against the bill. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
- Sen. Sullivan: Thank you Mr. Glynn. Did I miss anybody else on H.B. 6104? Then I again declare the hearing closed. H.B. 6643, An Act Concerning a Master Plan for Development. Anybody in favor? Anybody opposed? I declare the hearing closed in regard to that. H.B. 6868. An Act Amending The Charter of The Old Quarry Association. Anybody in favor?
- Arthur Hall: Mr. Chairman, members of the committee, my name is Arthur Hall, I live in Old Quarry in the Town of Guilford, and currently I'm President of The Old Quarry Association. The charter that this non-profit corporation was established in 1947 by Special Act 306, and has served its purpose admirably since that time. Recently however the members have unanimously approved 3 amendments. Mr. William Baskin the Attorney for the association is present and has prepared a very brief explanation of the amendments. With your permission I would like to have him come forth.
- William C. Baskin, Jr. Mr. Chairman and members of the committee, my name is William C. Baskin, Jr. and I'm a resident of Guilford, Conn. - Counsel for the Old Quarry Association. I have prepared a statement in explanation of H.B. 6868 which I will submit for the committee. Just very briefly because it's been a long afternoon, it's designed to correct two historical provisions in the charter which the charter has outgrown - a 6% interest limitation on the association's borrowing and a section to permit ~~tsponses~~ of landowners to serve as officers of the association and to clarify one other aspect of the association's charter which has become troublesome and that has to do with its zoning authority. If the committee will accept my statement in explanation of this bill, we would request favorable action on it.
- Sen. Sullivan: We will make the statement a part of the record. Do you have a question
- David Neiditz: What are the feelings of the Town of Guilford on this bill?
- Wm. Baskin: The Association is advised that the Town of Guilford does not oppose this legislation. In my statement in explanation I point out that a neighboring association The Sachem's Head Association has operated in precisely this fashion for a number of years without any conflict with the Town zoning authorities.
