In lines 4 and 5 delete the words "leased parking area" and substitute in lieu thereof "Parking Area Leased to the State"

This is a minor amendment. I highly approve of this bill. This merely makes it clear that any land which the State uses, cannot be used to charge state employees parking. But, we're trying to avoid what might have been a misconception, her. That if the State, leased land to a private operator we are not trying to fix his being able to charge for parking. This is merely clarifying this bill. I move for passage of the amendment.
