No. 6383, an Act concerning protection against rubella by immunization, File No. 673. Calendar No. 698, H.B. No. 7875, an Act concerning Tax Collectors' fees for issuing alias tax warrants, File No. 670. On Page 2, Calendar No. 701, H.B. No. 8117, an Act concerning the presence of police officers at elections, File No. 669. Calendar No. 708, Substitute for H.B. No. 5863, an Act concerning appeals in summary process cases, File No. 687. Calendar No. 719, Substitute for S.B. No. 1245, an Act concerning prohibiting the arbitrary cancellation of automobile insurance, File No. 542. I move the adoption and passage of these Bills.

THE CLERK:

Turn to Page 5, please. Third item from the top. Calendar No. 640, File No. 884. Favorable substitute report of the joint standing committee on State and Urban Development on Substitute Senate Bill 1349. An Act Concerning Housing Site Development Projects.

SENATOR CALDWELL:

Mr. President, may that also be passed? That's Senator Lieberman's bill and there is some question on it at the present.

THE CHAIR:

Pass retaining.

THE CLERK:

Second item from the bottom on Page 5. Calendar No. 646, File No. 687. Favorable substitute report of the joint standing committee on Judiciary on Substitute House Bill 5863. An Act Concerning Appeals in Summary Process Cases.

SENATOR JACKSON:

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the joint committee's favorable report and passage of the Bill.

THE CHAIR:

Will you remark?

SENATOR JACKSON:

Mr. President, this bill changes Section 52-542, which is the statute governing bonds on appeal and stay of execution in summary process cases. This bill provides a different procedure where the defendant appellant is occupying an apartment in a

tenement house for the procedure and other summary process appeals. In any appeal by a tenement house occupant, he shall file a bond with surety to guarantee payment of rents, and the bond is filed with time allowed for appeal, whereas the current law allows three days from fixing the bond for the time allowed for appeals, whichever is later. In other appeals, the Court on its motion or motion of the parties, may fix a sufficient bond with surety in amount as it may determine.

THE CHAIR:

The question is on passage. Will you remark further? If not, all those in favor of passage of the bill, signify by saying, "aye". Opposed, "nay". The ayes have it. The bill is passed.
