This piece of legislation has been requested by the Retirement Board Commission in order to clarify and unify one of the participating municipalities, who under collective bargaining had transferred three-quarters of their members into Fund B and let the other one-fourth sort of hanging dry. This bill simply allows the municipality, through its legislative body, to transfer the other 25% into Plan B. I think it is a necessity to the Retirement Commission therefore, I urge passage of this bill.

MR. SPEAKER:

Are there further remarks on the bill? The gentleman from the 95th.

RONALD A. SARASIN, 95th District:

Mr. Speaker, through you, sir, a question to the proponent of the bill. Will this still require a referendum to transfer the first three-quarters of the employees into Fund B?

MR. SPEAKER:

Does the gentleman care to respond?

NICHOLAS M. MOTTO, 3rd District:

Mr. Speaker, my impression of this is that the first 75% have already been transferred and it is to take care of the

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other 25%.

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the joint committee's

THE CHAIR:

Will you remark?

SENATOR PAC:

This bill would permit any municipality that has transferred
three-quarters of its employees from Fund A to Fund B by virtue
of this collective bargaining act of 1969. To do the same by an
Action, an resolution of its legislative body. In actuality what
happened they really thought in 1967 or 1969 that this was done
through this act. But it didn't happen. And talking to the state
retirement commission, they told me that actuarially there they are
on unsound ground. Because the fund is based on the actual
experience of all the employees that have been previously in the
fund. So this would transfer them and would save them some extra
work. The Amendment I spoke on Friday and I move the adoption of
