Rep. O'Dea: Anyone else in favor?

Rep. Ryan: I'm on the Enviroment and I'm on the Transportation Committee and I'm on Human rights and it seems that in every attempt that has been made with aid to the elderly or to give them a little break as to admission th the State Parks of fishing licenses or transportation facilities and I know its just helps to frustrate them so and I know they just upped the bus rates. Does the Transportation give any consideration to some method of identifying senior citizens like for instance if they could wear a pin, which has a number like the taxi cab drivers in New York, to make them stand out as being elderly citizens, so that they could get a reduced fund or pay an entrance fee or whatever. You haven't had any?

Mr. Laraia: Not to my knowledge they haven't, Representative, no. I discussed this with the Deputy Commissioner Kannel of the Bureau of Motor Carriers Service, and of course, he couldn't make it here to the hearing this morning, but he said he would, his feeling is that he would be in support of this, but we did not discuss the methods of identifying or establishing what is an elderly person.

Rep. O'Dea: Thank you Mr. Laraia. Anyone else in favor? Any opposition to the bill? Hearing is closed on 5929. The next bill 5941 AN ACT CONCERNING ISSUANCE AND DISPLAY OF NUMBER PLATES AND INSERTS. Anyone in favor?

Mr. Fitzgibbons: Members of the Committee, Arthur Fitzgibbons, Department of Transportation. H.B. 5941, this amendment of sub-section c of section 14-18 of the 1969 supplement to the General Statutes will allow Merritt and Wilbur Cross Parkway toll plates to be attached to the motor number vehicle plates. This will greatly assist the toll collectors in providing more effective visual obsevation of the toll plate and assist in our security measures. The Department of Transportation supports this bill. We found an illegality in our direction that we were having people attaching them to the plate and the law says that nothing should be attached to the plate. We're now asking that parking _____ give them out.

Rep. O'Dea: Any more questions? Next in favor?

Mr. Carroll: Mr. Chairman, members of the Transportaion Committee, I'm Edward Carroll representing the Department of Motor Vehicles, I'd like to direct my remarks, if I may, to H.B. 5941, which you are now considering and also to 6429. Both H.B. 5941 and H.B. 6429, would clarify any doubts which may exist under the present law by explicitly allowing toll plates to be affixed to registration plates allowing toll plates to be affixed to registration plates. We beleive, that H.B. 6429 is the better of the two bill in that, it provides that the toll plate be used in conjunction with the front marker and H.B. 6429 happens to be a Department bill. I have no
