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THE CLERK:

Please turn to page 7, on page 7 second matter, Calendar No. 690, Substitute for H.B. No. 8011, An Act Concerning the Out-of-State Purchase or Acquisition--

MR. MAHANEY (92nd):

Mr. Speaker, I wonder if I could ask the Clerk to please refer to the matter that he's calling again. I think there's some confusion on this.

THE CLERK:

Was that matter passed retaining earlier?

MR. MAHANEY (92nd):

Yes.

THE CLERK:

On page 7, in the middle of the page, Calendar No. 695, H.B. No. 5601, An Act Concerning Voting Eligibility and Procedures in Historical Districts, File No. 675.

MR. NEIDITZ (12th):

I move adoption of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

THE SPEAKER:

Question is on acceptance and passage. Would you remark?

MR. NEIDITZ (12th):

Mr. Speaker, this bill which was introduced by Representative Spiegel of Trumbull merely clarifies technically the voting procedures for the setting up of Historical Districts in those municipalities which want them. It does several things. It requires that when voting is by written ballot, the ballots be mailed by first class mail and that persons eligible to

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vote not later than seven days before, must be returned, the ballots must be returned to the Town Clerk. It also makes liable for the assessments of the Historical District people whose predecessors and title were responsible for those assessments. It, thirdly, requires that, it eliminates the requirement that fiduciaries or non-residents are not eligible to vote, and fourthly, requires the record owner of the property must be a record owner fourteen days before the ballots are returned. This is a bill that is necessary. Representative Spiegel in the Town of Monroe and I think that it does not take away anything from the Historic District, a bill that was passed in the last few sessions and I move it's adoption.

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THE SPEAKER:

Will you remark further on the bill? If not, all those in favor indicate by saying aye. Those opposed? The bill is PASSED.

THE CLERK:

Calendar No. 700, H.B. No. 8009, An Act Concerning Payment by Medical Service Corporations for Services of Chiropractors.

MR. HANNON (16th):

Mr. Speaker,

THE SPEAKER:

The gentleman from the 16th, my Calendar indicates this item has been disposed of on the preliminary call, Representative Hannon and Representative Collins would you come to the well of the House please.

MR. MAHANEY (92nd):

Mr. Speaker, the indication I have on this Calendar No. 700 is that it is a go situation. There has been no disposition of it.

THE SPEAKER:

I suggest that it be passed temporarily until it be cleared up.

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SENATE

SENATOR SMITH:

In concurrence of the bill as submitted by the house schedule (a). Mr. President is amended by H.B. schedule (a) protects that area given employees for their privacy from electronic surveillance. Calendar 670, File No. 675. Favorable Report Joint Senate Committee on Government Administration and Policy. H.B. 5601. An Act Concerning Voting Eligibility and Procedures in Historical Districts.

SENATOR SULLIVAN:

Mr. President, I move the acceptance Joint Committees favorable report and passage of the bill.

THE CHAIR:

Will you remark.

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SENATOR SULLIVAN:

Mr. President, this changes the existing statute to allow voting by written ballot; specifies the time in which the ballots are to be sent out. It allows peoples whose predecestors and titles were liable for taxes in the town to vote even though they were not liable on the particular grand list. It, also, changes the requirement that there must be a record owner of property for at least 14 days before the ballot. And that it changes the interest that joint owners of property shall have the right to vote their particular fraction of his own interest.
