Cal. 767. House Bill 9129. AN ACT CONCERNING MUTUAL INSURANCE COMPANIES CONTRIBUTING TO THE COST OF THE REHABILITATION DIVISION OF THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION COMMISSION.

MR. GENOVESE: (18th)

Mr. Speaker, I move for acceptance of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

Mr. Speaker, the term mutual insurance company is added to clarify the meaning of this section of the General Statutes. The term mutual association does not legally mean mutual insurance company as it is used in Section 31-328 of the Conn. General Statutes. Mutual Insurance Companies have been making contributions into the fund mentioned in this bill but they have not been specifically included within the legal meaning of the statute as it now stands, Without this change. While it was and is the intent that companies which issue the kinds of insurance indicated in this bill to make contributions to the maintenance of the rehabilitation division of the Workmen's

SENATOR DINIELLI:

Mr. President, this particular section of our statutes requires a minimum assessment of \$1,000. for carriers who have the ability to write workmen's compensation insurance and who do not in fact write it, yet they are assessed for the operation of the workmen's compensation section. This law would require that the assessment be applied only to people, only to companies who do in fact write the insurance and I think it is a fair approach. I think it is what was intended originally and it has been applied in another way.
