and we have often discussed how inhospitable Connecticut presently is, compared to other states to people who are able to move around and see the country for the first time in their life. Thank you.

Rep. Matthews: I am Rep. John Matthews of the 161st District. I have no prepared text, but I wish to speak on behalf of H.B. 5758, establishment of an Advisory Recreation Commission. In the town of New Canaan, Connecticut, we are now developing a large tract of land which is for recreational purposes. We would find this Advisory Recreation Commission extremely helpful if it were now in existence. We have discussed the matter on numerous occasions and are favorably impressed by the bill submitted. Our present Director of Recreation is in strong support of the bill, and I recommend it along with him. Thank you.

Rep. Rose: Mr. Chairman, members of the Environment Committee, I am Rufus Rose of the 69th District.

Rep. Ciampi: May we have a little quiet back there, because we can't hear the speaker. Please. If you want to talk, go in the hallway, and close the door. We're trying to get a bigger room, but just have a little patience. Thank you.

Rep. Rose: I would like to speak in favor of H.B. 5605, AN ACT CONCERNING THE WATERFORD-EAST LYME SHELLFISH COMMISSION. This act would revise the composition of the existing commission, at the request of the officials of both East Lyme and Waterford, and it is a reasonable request because the present set-up of the Commission requires that all three selectmen from the Town of Waterford serve on it, as well as three selectmen from the Town of East Lyme. They would prefer, because of the many duties they have, particularly in Waterford, that they be allowed to have one selectman serve on this commission, and the other three from the towns appointed by the Board of Selectmen, which would relieve them, and would give the townspeople and others well qualified to serve on this more participation in the activities of this commission. It is requested by both towns and the interest of both towns and the State, I think, would be served by having a much more reliable commission to work on their problems. I would like to leave with you a letter from the First Selectman from the Town of Waterford, who favors this. I would also like to speak on House Joint Resolution 16, I don't see a copy of it here in your bills. This is a statement of purpose resolution, which the Legislative Commissioners' office felt would best be presented in the form of a resolution, and it is primarily to encourage, by the action of our Assembly, and the Governor's signature, activity at our various research facilities under the University of Connecticut on oceanography. At present their activities are confined pretty much to the ecology studies of the oceans and the prevention of pollution. The intent of this resolution is to encourage them to involve
