Calendar No. 731, Substitute for H.B. No. 9130, An Act Concerning Powers and Duties of the Workmen's Compensation Commissioners.

MR. HOLDSWORTH (125th):

Mr. Speaker, I move for acceptance of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

MR. HOLDSWORTH (125th):

This bill basically is a housekeeping bill. It, the workmen's compensation commissioners shall reside in the district in which they are appointed, the exception for the commissioners serving on, has been eliminated. Further eliminated from the act is the exception of the commissioner appointed

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SENATOR SULLIVAN:

Mr. President, this changes the existing statute to allow voting by written ballot; specifies the time in which the ballots are to be sent out. It allows peoples whose predecestors and titles were liable for taxes in the town to vote even though they were not liable on the particular grand list. It, also, changes the requirement that there must be a record owner of property for at least 14 days before the ballot. And that it changes the interest that joint owners of property shall have the right to vote their particular fraction of his own interest.

THE CHAIR:
