Page 2 of the Calendar. Cal. No. 58. House Bill No. 5097. AN ACT CONCERNING SERVICE UPON NONRESIDENT ATTACHING CREDITOR. File No. 21.

Mr. Speaker, this bill is an amendment to existing legislation which now permits the service on subsequent nonresident attaching creditors by service on the attorney of record. In an action to foreclose a mortgage or mechanic's lien, under existing statutes, such types of service may be made. The purpose of the bill now before the House is to add to that statute the right to effect service on such nonresident attaching creditors in actions to foreclose a judgment lien and an action to foreclose a tax lien.
