So we have four teachers out of fifteen on the State Certification Advisory Board - four classroom teachers. Two of the four happen to be members of the State Federation of Teachers. That's why we are worried about Senator Gunther's bill and we would have our own bill - Senator Lieberman's bill - which I will point out does not only have teachers on the board but has other people as well.

In regards to if the parents are removed from this program how would one go about receiving the training. Well, they are mandated. Each school must provide driver education to any sixteen or seventeen year old individual. This is regardless of the fact whether or not he has dropped out of school and perhaps our job is to enforcethat is inform the public and inform the parent of this particular statute.
