Delete the remainder of line 22 and all of lines 23,24,25 and 26.

In line 36 delete the words political committee or and the comma after the word committee and add the following: Established under section 9-392 of the general statutes.

Delete the remainder of line 36 and all of lines 37,38,39 and 40

SENATOR IVES:

Mr. President, I move the adoption of the amendment. The bill as it came out of committee, in effect allowed incorporation of town committees and other political committees in existence for five years. The amendment limits the incorporation strictly to Town Committees.

particular program in the past by funding from the federal government and Hartford public foundations, it was money well spent. This is a good program, and I wish you'd give it serious consideration behind closed doors and come out with a favorable report. Thank you.

Nicholas Bonadies: Mr. Chairman, members of the Committee, my name is Nicholas C. Bonadies, citizen of the city of Hartford... (portion not audible-machine malfunction)...Oakland Civil Patrol. With the cooperation of the civic patrol and the police department, the crime rate has dropped 30%. They have done a tremendous job in the sense that when people get off the bus, they are watched carefully. In fact, my wife at one time was very reluctant to take a buss in the Albany Avenue area, but since the patrol has been there, this has changed, so I'm very favorable to this bill.

Senator Lieberman: Anyone else want to speak in favor of this Bill? Anyone against? If not, the hearing is closed. House Bill 8448. AN ACT PROVIDING THAT A CDAP SHALL BE OPTIONAL AND NOT A PREREQUISITE FOR STATE GRANTS-IN--AID. Anyone in favor? Mr. Cane, did you want to testify on the CDAP bill? In favor or against?

Mr. Cane: Against, but another bill.

Senator Lieberman: Anyone in favor? Against? If not, the hearing is closed. 8566, AN ACT CONCERNING PLANNING COMMISSION APPEALS. In favor? Opposed? The hearing is closed. 8567, AN ACT CONCERNING HOUSING. Representative Panuzio is here but he couldn't stay, and he's submitted a statement in support of this bill, which I gather is pretty simple. It says the state shall replace, or cause to be replaced, any housing units demolished to make way for any State construction program on a one for one basis.

Senator Lieberman: And now 8567. Any one in favor or opposed to this one? Declare the hearing closed. Senate Bill 1642, AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE STATE PARK AND FOREST COMMISSION TO EXCHANGE CERTAIN LAND. In favor? Against? The hearing is closed. 1633, AN ACT ESTABLISHING A PLANNING BOARD OF APPEALS. The hearing is closed. 8624. AN ACT CONCERNING TENANT REPRESENTATION ON THE HOUSING AUTHORITY. We've had some like this before. Anyone in favor? Opposed? The hearing is closed. 8625, AN ACT CONCERNING HOUSING AUTHORITY GUARDS FOR WATERBURY HOUSING PROJECTS AND AUTHORIZING SPECIAL CONSTABLES AS GUARDS FOR HOUSING PROJECTS. In favor? Opposed?
