MR. CHAGNON:

None whatsoever, Mr. Speaker.

MR. SPEAKER:

I suggest this item be passed temporarily and that we return to it after the gentleman has had an opportunity to check the file.

CLERK:

Calendar No. 107, House Bill 6788 - An Act Concerning The State Employees Retirement Fund, file 103.

MR. DUDA:

Mr. Speaker.

MR. SPEAKER:

Representative Duda, from the 58th.

MR. DUDA:

I move acceptance of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

MR. SPEAKER:

Questions on acceptance of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill. Will you remark?

MR. DUDA:

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Mr. Speaker, this bill is in the nature of a house-keeping bill would place the present procedure applying a surplus in the budget to the State Employee's Retirement Fund on an annual basis which, to conform to the annual sessions and the annual budgets. I urge its adoption.

MR. SPEAKER:

The Clerk have an amendment on this Calendar item?

CLERK:

Yes. House Amendment Schedule "A".

In line 5, after the word "one".

In line 6 delete the words "million five" and insert before the word "hundred" the word "seven" and after the word "hundred" the word "fifty".

MR. SPEAKER:

Would you remark on the amendment. Representative Sarasin from the 95th.

MR. SARASIN:

Mr. Speaker, I urge adoption of the amendment.

MR. SPEAKER:

Will you remark further on the amendment.

MR. SARASIN:

I would point out that the amendment simply cleans up the remainder of the bill. The first part of the bill itself changing biennium to fiscal year because we're on annual basis and the amendment merely changes one million five hundred thousand to seven hundred and fifty thousand, to bring it in line

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with that one year term.

MR. SPEAKER:

Will you remark further on Amendment Schedule "A".

Representative Duda from the 58th.

MR. DUDA:

Mr. Speaker, the amendment is a sound one and was overlooked by the committee, I urge its adoption.

MR. SPEAKER:

Further comments on the amendment. If not, the question is on adoption of House Amendment Schedule "A". All those in favor, indicate by saying "Aye". Those opposed. The amendment is adopted, the Chair will rule it technical. We can proceed with the bill as amended. Will you remark further on the bill as amended. If not, all those in favor, indicate by saying "Aye". Those opposed. The bill as amended is passed.

The Clerk will return to Calendar 105, House Bill 6299 - An Act Concerning Pensions for Surviving Spouses of Judges, file no. 99.

MR. SPEAKER:

Representative Ajello from the 118th.

MR. AJELLO:

Mr. Speaker, there is no objection to that item be referred to Appropriations and I would so move.
