## GOVERNMENTAL ADMINISTRATION AND POLICY

WEDNESDAY

H.B. 6715 (Rep. Nevas of the 14th.) AN ACT AMENDING THE CHARTER OF THE TOWN OF WESTPORT. I know Rep. H.B. 5472 (Rep. Camp of the 163rd.) AN ACT CONCERNING VOTING ON THE CONSOLIDATION OF GOVERNMENTS. Anybody here on that?

H.B. 6106 (Rep. Kennelly of the 1st, Rep. Carragher of the 2nd, Sen. Smith of the 2nd.) AN ACT CONCERNING AMENDMENT OF SECTION 2 OF CHAPTER 1, SPECIAL ACT NO. 30 OF THE 1947 SESSION OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

- Michael Scenti: Mr. Chairman, members of the committee, my name is Michael Scenti. I'm Division Engineer in charge of the maps and records for the city of Hartford, member of the Engineering Department.

First I wish to dispute some of the statements made by the prior speakers with regards to sub-diffuse and trying to more or less take some land that probably belong to the other towns.

I have here in my notes where I made visits to the various towns surrounding Hartford on dates between December 15th and 16th, 1970. Also I have copies of letters to the various town officials who are mentioned in the act. The letters were sent to the town managers or the mayor along with representatives and also the senators of the various towns.
