CAL. NO. 93 FILE NO. 111. Favorable report of the joint standing committee on Human Rights and Opportunities. Senate Bill No. 1131. An Act Concerning Discretionary Refusal of Permits by Liquor Control Commission.

THE CHAIR:

We will have to temporarily pass this as the Senator in charge is temporarily absent.

CAL. NO. 99. FILE NO. 119. Favorable report of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary. Substitute for Senate Bill No. 557. An Act Concerning Probation and Parole at the Connecticut Correctional Institution, Cheshire.

SENATOR JACKSON:

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the joint committees favorable report and passage of the bill.

SENATOR JACKSON:

Mr. President, this bill amends existing legislation so as to correct Section 1873 of the General Statutes and make that section reflect that the correct names of our State Prisons, Jails and Reformatories. Also, the bill starting in line 26, adds provision for so-called split sentence. A Judge would it now gives a Judge the right to sentence an offender to Cheshire for not less than 6 months and at the same time, have probation for the remaining part of the sentence. At the present time, the Judge does not have the power to add a probationary period on his sentence.

Under the present law, no vault, moseleum or columbarium can be located above ground except that an established cemetary of five acres or more. This bill would permit the location of coumbarium on the premises of religious organizations. These columbariums of course, contained the creamated remains of the dead and in no way would it be a health hazard. I think its a good bill. I think in this day and age when land is becoming scarce we should perhaps encourage more people to take advantage of this service.
