THE CLERK:

Cal. 771. Sub. for H.B. 7802. AN ACT CONCERNING EMPLOYMENT PROTECTION FOR MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

THE SPEAKER:

Rep. Donnelly.

MR. DONNELLY: (46th)

Mr. Speaker, I would move acceptance of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

THE SPEAKER:

Question is acceptance and passage. Will you remark.

MR. DONNELLY: (46th)

Mr. Speaker, I would like to yield to the gentleman from the 95th for the purposes of introducing an amendment.

MR. SARASIN: (95th)

The Clerk has an amendment.

THE CLERK:

House Amendment Schedule A, offered by Mr. Hannon of the 16th and Mr. Sarasin of the 95th. In line 26, delete everything after the period. Delete lines 27 through 36, inclusive.

MR. SARASIN: (95th)

Mr. Speaker, the deletions in the amendment offered here, Schedule A, will take out all of the capitalization on Page 2 of File 757 and what it does is eliminate the provision

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that's in the file which would require the State of Connecticut to make up for any lost wages or salary as a result of service in this General Assembly. I submit to you, sir, that this would be something extremely difficult to prove and in addition to that it is the intention, as I understand it, to appoint a commission of people not connected with the General Assembly to review the salary and status of the members of the General Assembly and then report to this Body. I would suggest that this kind of a proposal, if it is ever to be one, should come from that Commission and it should not be something that be acted on this floor today. I move the adoption of House Amendment Schedule A.

THE SPEAKER:

Question is on adoption of House Amendment Schedule A. Will you remark further. All those in favor, signify by saying AYE. Contrary-minded. The amendment is ADOPTED. I move it technical and we will proceed with the passage of the bill. Rep. Donnelly.

MR. DONNELLY: (46th)

Mr. Speaker, the bill as amended has two effects. It extend to an employee protection of seniority status that he may have achieved in his regular employment, that protection to be extended to him if he be a candidate or if indeed he be a successful candidate and elected either to this Body or to the Senate upstairs. In addition, such employee is given shift preference if indeed his work is performed in shifts. I think

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both of these steps are important if we are to make meaningful available to wageearners in our State a real possibility of membership in this General Assembly. I urge passage of the bill.

THE SPEAKER:

Question is on passage of the bill as amended. Will you remark further. If not, all those in favor signify by saying AYE. Contrary-minded. The bill is PASSED.

Page 14, Cal. 773, House Bill 5245. AN ACT REPEALING THE REQUIREMENT THAT MOTORCYCLISTS AND THEIR PASSENGERS WEAR HEADGEAR.

THE SPEAKER:

The gentleman from the 69th.

MR. ROSE: (69th)

I move acceptance of the joint committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

THE SPEAKER:

Question is on acceptance and passage. Would you remark.

MR. ROSE: (69th)

Yes, Mr. Speaker. First I want to thank the Committee

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the vocational agriculture schools in relocating will come under the general building fund. Calendar No. 771, Substitute for House Bill No. 7802,

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An Act Concerning Employment Protection for Members of the General Assembly.

RONALD A. SARASIN, 95th District:

Mr. Speaker, I move adoption of the joint committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

MR. SPEAKER:

MR. SARASIN, 95th District:

Mr. Speaker, the Clerk has an amendment.

MR. SPEAKER:

Will the Clerk call House Amendment Schedule "A"?

THE CLERK:

House Amendment Schedule "A" was adopted by the House on May 11th.

MR. SARASIN, 95th District:

It should be House Amendment Schedule "B", Mr. Speaker.

MR. SPEAKER:

The calendar did not indicate but this appears House Amendment Schedule "A" is adopted. The gentleman has now moved for adoption of House Amendment Schedule "B".

THE CLERK:

House Amendment Schedule "B" offered by M. Sarasin of the 95th:

In line 38, after the word "passage: insert a period and delete the remainder of line 38 and lines 39 and 40.

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RONALD A. SARASIN, 95th District:

Mr. Speaker, the purpose of this amendment is to correct an oversight that was made when we adopted House Amendment Schedule "A". At that time we took out all of the capitalized section commencing with line 26 and through line 36 and overlooked the fact that Section 2, in line 38 refers back to that section. This amendment merely takes out the language after the word passage in line 38 because there is nothing to refer back to. I move the adoption of the amendment.

MR. SPEAKER:

Will you remark further on the adoption of House Amendment Schedule "B"? If not, all those in favor indicate by saying aye, opposed? Schedule "B" is adopted and is ruled technical. Will you remark further on the bill as twice amended? If not, all those in favor indicate by saying aye, opposed? The bill is passed.
