MR. CARROZZELLA: (81st)

Mr. Speaker, what this does, it would equalize the jury terms in all of our courts. Right now in the Superior Court, the Court of Common Pleas the jury term is four weeks, on the Circuit Court it is eight weeks. This bill would make the jury term equal in all courts, thereby making it available to use a common panel which would save the people of the State money. It is a good bill. I urge its passage.'
