This bill would provide relief for the elderly persons who's property held in trust, so they are eligible the same as if the property was in their name, and was not in trust with their life use of the particular property. There are also some other functions of the college of agriculture that could be very seriously affected by this particular bill, due to the fact, that I do not have the details this morning I would like permission to submit a later statement to the committee relative to this matter. Now, on one other bill which is HB 6836, AN ACT CONCERNING EXEMPTION FROM LIVESTOCK, POULTRY AND FARM MACHINERY, this particular bill, makes one rather simple change in the act. I think that when we doubt that at the time when or of the Acts original passage, and this is Section 12-91, which is being affected, that anyone could visualize the problem that might be created when a bonafied farm following the death of its owner and held in trust for its surviving family, would be excluded from the provisions, of this section of our statutes. I am talking about 12-91, yet this has happened. We have had some situations in which the father having passed away, left the farm in trust to his wife and children, they continued to operate
