SENATOR HOULEY:

Mr. President, I move the acceptance of the joint committee's favorable report and passage of the bill. This carries an appropriation of 10,500 dollars. I'm not certain what effect it will have after today's breakoff of negotiations. However, I do urge the adoption. What it does is increase the appropriation to the Winchester, Torrington and Putnam, Willimantic and Tolland Law Libraries, for a total increase in the five counties of some 10,500 dollars. It is, Mr. President, in effect, a small token to illustrate that for far too long some of the smaller libraries in the state of Connecticut, have been neglected, in favor of some of the larger municipal law libraries and therefore, I urge its passage.

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THE CHAIR:
