MR. ERVIN (140th):

Mr. Speaker, I move acceptance of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

THE SPEAKER:

Would you remark?

MR. ERVIN (140th):

Yes, Mr. Speaker. This is a bill of a real technical nature and it's short interesting factual situation but in a certain estate in Stafford Probate Court, when it was settled, a son who had borrowed money from a Federal Credit Union had approximately \$923 coming to him out of the estate. However, this son had disappeared back in 1968 and since that date has still disappeared. He had borrowed over \$1300 from Workers Federal Credit Union and in the interim they had brought suit against him and under our statutes, this money of the disappeared son went into the State Treasury. The State, the Attorney General's Office, however, although the money was legally garnished and is a debt, a judgment in our courts, was reluctant to release the money to the credit, The Workers Federal Credit Union until under our statutes or by a special bill today, we gave authority for the State of Connecticut to turn this debt over to the credit union. The bill in question merely seeks the consent and authorization which the Attorney General claims is lacking. In justice sake, Mr. Speaker, we feel it should be passed.

MRS. GREEN (93rd):

Mr. Speaker, thank you. Mr. Speaker, I move acceptance of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

THE SPEAKER:

The Chair recognizes the gracious lady from the 93rd, Rep. Green. Will you remark?

MRS. GREEN (93rd):

Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The Clerk has an amendment. Will the Clerk please read the amendment?

THE SPEAKER:

The Clerk will call Amendment Schedule "A".

THE CLERK:

House Amendment Schedule "A" offered by Mr. Nevas of the 144th.

In line 112, after the period, insert the following: "Such written notice and the copy thereof shall be sent by registered or certified mail."

In line 244, after the word "filing" strike out the words "a letter" and insert the following: "an affidavit".

In line 245, before the word "by" insert the words "and sworn to".

THE SPEAKER:

Question is on adoption of Amendment "A". Will you remark?

MRS. GREEN (93rd):

Yes, thank you. The signer of a petition may withdraw his name. The amendment just makes sure that the candidate gets the notice of the withdrawal. In lines 244 and 245, provide that no one other than a petitioning candidate can withdraw his name. They're simple amendments and I urge adoption.

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THE SPEAKER:

Further remarks on Amendment Schedule "A"? If not, all those in favor indicate by saying aye. OPPOSED? Amendment "A" is ADOPTED.

MRS. GREEN (93rd):

Thank you. Mr. Speaker, an increasing number of electors in Connecticut are availing themselves of the nominating petition procedure to secure a place on the ballot for elective office. The increased use of these sections of our statutes have brought to light the need of improvement and clarification. Most of these changes are of technical nature. Aside from technical and clarification changes, H. B. No. 9220 increases from one-half of one percent to one percent, the number of signatures needed to achieve a place on the ballot. Also, no name of petitioning candidates shall appear on the ballot under a party designation unless petitioning candidates are approved for offices numbering at least fifty percent of the number of offices to be filled. This prevents one candidate filing one office under as many party designations as he chooses, possibly using up all the lines of the ballot, thus forcing the election to paper ballots. This situation could happen and almost did in a recent election in one of our municipalities. This bill is an Election Commission bill and has the complete bipartisan support from all the members. I urge its passage.

THE SPEAKER:

Further remarks on the bill as amended? If not, all those in favor indicate by saying aye. Opposed? The bill is PASSED.
