Yes, Mr. Speaker. This bill will require the Attorney General to prepare a topical and chronological cross index of all legal opinions issued and to be issued by his office. This bill was the result of the recommendation of the auditors of the public accounts to accumulate in one place all Attorney General opinions. We have been assured, that is the Finance Committee has, that the cost involved is minimal and that there is no additional staff necessary. There is no printing or distribution requirement of the bill as it stands. I urge its passage.

Recommendations of Auditors of Public Accounts in their
Biennial Report to the 1971 Session of the General Assembly
Together with Legislative Bill Numbers

- 1. Amend Section 4-63 of the General Statutes:
B. 8983 To provide for the establishment of performance auditing
- 2. Amend Section 4-63:
B. 1567 To provide that, in the State service, the personnel classification of "auditor" shall not be used in reference to personnel of any agency other than the Auditors of Public Accounts.
- 3. Amend Section 4-63:
B. 1570 To provide the requirement that the Auditors of Public Accounts report any instances of unauthorized, illegal, irregular, or unsafe handling or expenditure of State funds to the Joint Legislative Management Committee as well as to the Governor.
- 4. Make provision in Chapter 47 of the General Statutes:
B. 1553 To require prompt notification to the Auditors of Public Accounts and the State Comptroller by all agency heads of any instances of wrongdoing, questionable handling or expenditure of State funds, or breakdowns in the safekeeping of any other resources of the State.
- 5. Make provision in Chapter 18a of the General Statutes:
B. 1552 To establish a legislative audit review committee.
- 1. Amend Section 4-86:
B. 1566 To provide budgetary control over refunds of current year expenditures.
- 2. Make provision in Chapter 50, Part II, of the General Statutes:
B. 1548 To establish legislative budget control over certain of the State's working capital (revolving) funds.
- 3. Amend Sections 4-66 and 3-115:
B. 1575 To require the furnishing of regular monthly financial statements for the State's General and Highway Funds.
- 4. Amend Sections 3-114b and 3-115:
B. 1562 To permit the State Comptroller to submit his annual report to the Governor on or before September 1 rather than, as at present, August 15 in order to enable a more accurate reporting of Sales Tax collections.
- 5. Make provision in Chapter 18a of the General Statutes:
To establish a legislative commission to study and, where deemed warranted, to propose revision of those statutes pertaining to budgetary, fiscal, and accounting policies of the State.

- 6. Amend Section 5-156:
To provide for regular transfers from the State General and Highway Funds to the State Employees' Retirement Fund for so long as the resources of the latter fund are not equal to the amount of members' vested interest in their contributions.
- B - 7. None required (practice of "lump sum" budgeting).
- B - 8. Make provision in Chapter 32, Part I, of the General Statutes:
To standardize the investment laws pertaining to Civil List Funds (moneys on deposit for State Government Funds as distinguished from Trust Funds).
B. 1572
- B - 9. Amend Section 3-16:
To invoke for temporary borrowing purposes certain of the requirements set forth in Section 3-20 of the General Statutes in reference to the issuance of State bonds.
B. 1568
- B - 10. None required (separate investment division in State Treasurer's office.)
- B - 11. None required (discourage any additional State payroll deduction programs).
- 12. Amend Section 3-119 and provide appropriation funding:
To reaffirm the legislative mandate for an effective State payroll/personnel system and to provide the funding necessary to implement the system.
B. 1561
- B - 13. Amend Section 3-112:
To require the preparation and issuance by the Comptroller of effective accounting and payroll manuals for use by the various agencies of the State.
B. 1565
- B - 14. None required (adoption of a complete legislative budget plan including estimated revenues as well as an expenditure plan).
- C - 1. Amend Section 5-199:
To require that current and complete personnel regulations be prepared and issued in manual form to all agencies of the State.
B. 1564
- C - 2. Amend Section 5-198:
To provide for uniformity of fringe benefits, pay grades and classifications in the Executive Department's unclassified service with those in the classified service.
- C - 3. Amend Section 5-211:
To exclude from meritorious service award consideration employees in an executive, administrative, or professional capacity.
B. 1569

1. None required (legislative review of the policy of fiscal autonomy and lump sum budgeting in the area of higher education and a clearer definition of the intended role of the boards of trustees of the various constituent units of the Commission on Higher Education).
- 2. Amend Section 4-53:
1571 To define more clearly the activities and operations of State institutions of higher learning which are intended to be conducted and accounted for within student activity funds.
- 3. Amend, as necessary, Sections 4-31a, 4-32, and 10-121:
1551 To clarify and correlate better the statutory provisions governing the receipt, recording, and holding by the University of Connecticut and the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station of gifts, contributions, or other income.
- 1. Make provision in Chapter 48 of the General Statutes:
1573 To require State referee approval of proposed payments, in excess of fifteen thousand dollars for negotiated property takings for non-highway purposes similar to that required in Section 13a-74 for highway property takings.
2. Amend Section 8-114a:
1554 To define more clearly the amount of State financial assistance which may be rendered to local housing authorities for the housing program for elderly persons.
- 3. Repeal the provisions of Special Act 22 of 1949:
1574 To eliminate the Health Department's Reagent Sales Fund and to provide for the testing and distribution services to be financed from the State General Fund.
- 4. Amend Section 3-125:
1549 To require the preparation of an effective topical and chronological indexing of legal opinions issued by the Office of the Attorney General.
- 5. Make provision in Chapter 201 of the General Statutes:
1550 To require each corporation commencing operations in Connecticut to post a bond of perhaps \$100.00 to be used in the event the corporation should become delinquent in respect to tax payments.
- 6. Make provision in Chapter 47 of the General Statutes:
1555 To provide for a standard penalty of perhaps \$5.00 to be assessed for the issuing of bad checks to the State.
- 7. Amend Section 22-11 and repeal Section 22-12:
To bring statutory provisions into line with budgetary process adopted for the County Extension Services by the General Assembly in 1967.

- 8. Make provisions under Title 51 of the General Statutes:
7.1556 To define time limits on the payment or collection of non-cash bail or court appearance bonds when they are called and declared forfeited.

- 9. Amend Sections 4-31a and 4-52:
8.1565 To clarify the basis, if deemed warranted, on which gifts, contributions, or donations from any private source may be deposited into an institutional activity fund rather than being placed in the State General Fund and being deemed appropriated to the purposes of such gifts, contributions, or donations.

- 10. Make provision in Chapter 48:
To define standard guidelines to assist appointive members of State boards and commissions in determining reasonable limits on their dealings as private citizens with the groups on which they serve.
