THE SPEAKER:

The gentleman from the 118th.

MR. AJELLO: (118th)

Directing the attention to a matter just received from the Senate as a Disagreeing Action. Substitute for H.B. 6696, File 701 and I would yield to the distinguished representative Guy LaGrotta who will explain the amendment and move its adoption.

MR. LAGROTTA: (170th)

Mr. Speaker, this amendment allows a school board, a school district or regional board to have an option where they will take state service or half the money and buy their own superintendent. It's a good bill and I urge its passage.

THE SPEAKER:

Further remarks on the amendment. Is that correct, Amendment A. All those in favor of Amendment A indicate by saying AYE. Opposed. Senate A is ADOPTED.

MR. PAPANDREA: (78th)

Mr. Speaker, I move the bill as amended by Senate Amendment A.

Further remarks. If not, all those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Opposed. THE BILL IS PASSED.

Before we return to the Ethics Bill, Mr. Speaker, I call Cal. 1635, Sub. for S.B. 1139, File 1702. AN ACT CONCERNING RELOCATION ASSISTANCE. It clarifies the existence of the re-

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location assistance programs in the State of Connecticut. It's a good bill and it ought to pass.

MR. AJELLO: (118th)

I would point out respectfully to the members of this House that this bill does not go into effect until January 3, 1973 and the Judiciary Committee will be in session during the interim, we will be in session next year in February, we will take into account all of these amendments.
