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THE SPEAKER:

Further remarks on the bill? If not, all those in favor indicate by saying aye. Opposed? Will all those in favor indicate by saying aye. Opposed?

The bill is PASSED.

MR. PAPANDREA (78th):

Mr. Speaker, may we then proceed to the first item on page 6, Calendar No. 1512.

THE SPEAKER:

The Clerk will call the first calendar item on page 6.

THE CLERK:

Calendar No. 1512, substitute for S.B. No. 1144, An Act Concerning the Establishment of an Office of Solid Waste Management Within the Department of Health.

MR. O'NEILL (52nd):

Mr. Speaker, I move for the acceptance of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill in concurrence with the Senate.

THE SPEAKER:

Will you remark?

MR. O'NEILL (52nd):

Mr. Speaker, this particular act establishes an office of solid waste management within the Department of Health. I believe the original appropriation was \$25,000, Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, I move that when the vote be taken, it be taken by roll call.

THE SPEAKER:

Question is on a roll call. All those in favor indicate by saying aye. A roll call will be ordered. Further remarks?

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MRS. CLARK (101st):

Mr. Speaker, through you, a question to the author of this bill.

THE SPEAKER:

Rep. Clark has the floor.

MRS. CLARK (101st):

Isn't it true that under the Department of Environment bill, the solid waste management within the heart of the Department of Health was transferred to the Department of the Environment. Would there be any conflict with this?

THE SPEAKER:

Would the gentleman from the 73rd care to respond?

MR. LAVINE (73rd):

Mr. Speaker, I'd like to assure the distinguished lady that the formative environment bill provides for the orderly transfer of this particular department into the Department of Environment.

MRS. CLARK (101st):

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

THE SPEAKER:

Further remarks before I announce an immediate roll call? During this time, are there announcements or introductions?

MR. MATTHEWS (161st):

Mr. Speaker, if I might, I would like to introduce my daughter, Debbie Matthews, who is sitting in the well of the House. She's been working in the Republican State Headquarters and she has become known to a number of the people here. Those who haven't recognized her yet, with shiny blue eyes from her dad, I'd like to introduce my daughter, Debbie. If she'd stand, I'd

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like to have the House give her a welcome.

THE SPEAKER:

Further announcements or introductions? If not, for the benefit of the members who have just returned to the House, we're on page 6, the first calendar item. Acceptance and passage has been moved, at which point, a roll call was asked for. A sufficient number called for it and a roll call has been ordered. Will you remark further on the bill?

MR. SARASIN (95th):

Mr. Speaker, I rise in opposition to the bill. I point out that the bill calls for an appropriation of \$35,000, which is not in either budget, neither the Democratic budget or the Governor's proposed budget. I would further point out that the Department of Finance and Control estimates that this bill to initiate would, in fact, cost almost \$37,000, for which no money has been provided. The Department of Health has not asked for this legislation. This is not a department bill. In fact, they're opposed to it. There is presently constituted within the department, a chief of solid wastes. This function could be transferred laterally within the department. And I'd further point out, that we've created a Department of the Environment and we are now trying to tell the new department how, in fact, they're going to be set up and I feel this should be left up to the new commissioner. It's our feeling that we should be opposed to this bill and allow the new Department of Environment to take care of this in their own manner and it will be taken care of.

THE SPEAKER:

Further remarks on the bill?

MR. O'NEILL (52nd):

Mr. Speaker.

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Rep. O'Neill, speaking for the second time.

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MR. O'NEILL (52nd):

Mr. Speaker, speaking for the second time, I rise to support this particular bill. Yes, we are creating within the Public Health Department, a Department of Solid Waste Management and yes, Mr. Speaker, we, on this side, feel that this money is contained within our budget, the Democratic budget, in the Health Department's budget. It's a good bill, Mr. Speaker, and I move its adoption and passage.

THE SPEAKER:

Further remarks on the bill? Let me announce the roll call one final time.

For most of the members here, may I repeat something I said earlier this afternoon? Last days and last weeks are always extremely difficult. However, it has been decided, in an attempt to facilitate this evening, that of necessity, we will have to ask no one be on the floor except members and staff. I realize that many of you may have family or friends coming but until we have completed the business, I would ask that the family and friends and invited guests use the gallery so that we can complete with decorum the business of the House of Representatives.

MR. AJELLO (118th):

Along those same lines, might I indicate to the members that we're going to continue our practice of having members of the leadership on either side contact the Clerk in order to facilitate the Clerk's being able to keep track of our rapid moves in various directions here and we will be trying to facilitate the business by moving about on the calendar. It's not practical at a time like this to announce in advance our schedule, so we'll ask you

all to bear with us. Those of you who have matters to report out are asked to remain in attendance or at least to let us know where you are so that we don't have to go looking for you because we frankly don't intend to. And we would ask everybody's forbearance, if you have a member, a matter rather, particularly matters on this side of the aisle who might be interested in knowing whether or not there will be any suspension of the rules, please do not bring these matters to the attention of the Republican leaders directly. We have asked that that not be done. Bring it to us and we will do our best to keep you informed. Don't think they're rude if they don't want to discuss it with you. Thank you.

THE SPEAKER:

The Clerk has two corrections on the calendar to make before we proceed with the roll call.

THE CLERK:

Would you please turn to page 8 of the calendar, there is an omission of a bill on page 8. Will you please insert between Calendar No. 1566 and Calendar No. 1569, insert Calendar No. 1568, S.B. No. 680, An Act Concerning Provisions of Open Spaces for School Subdivision Plans, File 1240. This appeared on yesterday's calendar at page 19. It should be on page 8 today with two stars.

On page 17, the last item which does not appear in its entirety on my calendar, Calendar No. 1668, H.B. No. 9257, An Act Concerning Solicitation of Charitable Funds, a favorable report of the committee on Corrections, Welfare and Humane Institutions.

THE SPEAKER:

It is my understanding that as of yet there is no file number, it

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was in under certification yesterday afternoon late.

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Further announcements or introductions? If not, will the members be seated and we'll proceed with the vote. Mr. Speaker, may we now return to the third item from the top on page 4, Calendar No. 1124.

THE CLERK:

Page 4, Calendar No. 1124, substitute for S. B. No. 1349, An Act Concerning Housing Site Development Projects, as amended by Senate Amendment Schedule "A".

MR. METTLER (96th):

Mr. Speaker, I move acceptance and passage of, acceptance of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill in concurrence with the Senate.

THE SPEAKER:

Will you remark?
