THE CLERK:

CAL. NO. 1359. Favorable report of the joint committee's favorable report on Appropriations. Senate Bill 1839. An Act Establishing the Time Limit For the Report of the Interim Commission to Study the Means of Providing Greater Opportunities for Non-college Bound Students and Providing For Occupational Training in Public Schools.

SENATOR HOULEY:

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the joint committee's favorable report and passage of the bill. This act extends the study time for the non-college bound youth committee and leaves the unextended incumbent balance of 3412 dollars to carry this out.
