May I summarize it, Mr. Speaker, please? Senate Amendment Schedule "A" merely gives consent to the Commissioner of Health, Commissioner of Mental Health to confer with the Commissioner of Corrections in referring inmates to the new mental health center and it merely adds the authority to this other commissioner of our state government to perform this.

THE SPEAKER:

Further remarks on Senate "A"? If not, all those in favor indicate by saying aye. Opposed? Amendment "A" is ADOPTED.

SENATOR JACKSON:
