Favorable Report Joint Standing Committee on the Environment, Substitute H.B. 5273. An Act Concerning Combination Hunting, Trapping and Sport Fishing Licenses For Elderly Persons.

THE CHAIR:

Senator Pac.

SENATOR PAC.

Mr. President, I move acceptance of the Joint Committee's Favorable Report and passage of the bill.

THE CHAIR:

Will you remark?

SENATOR PAC:

This bill would waive any fees for hunting , Trapping and Fishing Licenses for residences over 65. Currently the annual fee is \$1.35 and the permanent fee is \$5.35. Actually this amounts to something like an income of \$15,000. to the State. It is an infinitesimal sum. And I urge the passage of this bill. It would bring some of the elderly out in the fresh air and sunshine and perhaps they would spend less time in hospitals and be less costly.
